SEPTEMBER FLAME (Murphy 2012)
Dormant. diploid, height 48", bloom size 5.5", blooms very late, 2 way branching, 22 buds. Unusual Form Cascade. Bright red



with narrow cream edge, white midrib, chartreuse throat, very recurved. Moderately sunfast. Bud builder. (After

Awhile Crocodile × When I Dream) × Barnegat Light) Pod and pollen fertile. Value \$80.



STRETCH (Murphy 2012)
Dormant, diploid, height 47", bloom size 9", blooms midseason late, 2 way

branching, 20 buds. Spider Ratio 5.00:1. Cherry red spider with a white midrib above a light green throat. Seven week bloom period. Bud builder. Sunfast at 95°F. (Barnegat Light × Kirsten Madeline Burkey) Pod and pollen fertile. Value \$85.

From the May Sale Chair:

FELLOW NEDS MEMBERS,

It's time to think "MAY PUBLIC PLANT SALE & AUCTION".

The sale will again be held at the First Congregational Church, 1 Church St. Wakefield, MA. As was decided at last Octobers' meeting, due to the CAN-AM meeting on the second weekend of May our sale will be on Saturday, May 24 this year. Also this year the sale will be held in the upstairs hall of the church, as was last August's sale.

The hall will open at 9 AM for those who are sellers. Tables need to be reserved in advance by contacting me at paka1968@comcast.net. Also potted plant sales are permitted. Help will be needed to set up tables, chairs, etc. The sale will start at 10AM and go to 12 noon (unless sale activity would dictate otherwise), when the transition to the auction will start. This process should take about 30 minutes. People staying for the auction can break for lunch at this time. Prior to starting the auction the drawing for the monthly door prizes will be held. The auction will then proceed until all plants are sold. The premises will then need to be clean and restored to its prior condition.

PLEASE REMEMBER THIS IS ONE OF OUR TWO MAJOR FUNDRAISERS FOR THE YEAR. THE ENTIRE MEMBERSHIP NEEDS TO BE INVOLVED.

For people who can't come to the sale or auction, I'm sure most or all of us have plants that are auctionable. That is, plants that are worth \$20 or more. I'm also confident that most if not all of you have plants which need dividing. This would be a good time to contribute a couple of fans or clumps to help raise money to pay for the rental of Tower Hill, the speakers brought in by our program chair and the daylily exhibition in July, which are all part of your membership benefits.

A personal suggestion to people selling plants: I have been selling at the May sale for the past 2 years and have priced my plants with the idea that local people, who may not be total daylily enthusiasts, are not normally going to spend \$15 - \$25 on a daylily. Their mentality is to get a bargain priced plant for \$5 - \$7 hoping that it will flower that year. So usually, I will sell 3 fan clumps (sometimes more) for \$5 - \$7 and have done pretty well both years I participated. Statistical backup for this is the CDS Plant sale which gets over 80% of their revenue from their sale from plants priced between \$5 & \$9 and their gross sales are several times in excess of the NEDS sale.

Thanks, in advance for all your help.

From the Babysitting Plant Chair:

At the April 2014 meeting we will be drawing names for this year's babysitting plants. As stated in previous newsletters we have made a change to the Babysitting Program and we now have received donations from NEDS hybridizers and these are the plants that will be available to choose from. There no longer will be \$100 reimbursement for purchasing a plant. Only those not currently growing a Babysitting plant are eligible, you also need to be an AHS member and attended at least 3 NEDS functions in the past 12 months. If you are eligible and interested please contact me as soon as possible. For those attending the April meeting I ask that you will have reviewed the plants being made available and have a predetermined rank order of what you would like to grow so that we can handle as much of this as possible at the meeting. The plants will be available at the May sale. The choice of plant will be based on the order the names are drawn. The winners will then grow the plants for a full 3 years and return for sale at the August 2016 NEDS auction.

2013 NEDS Treasurer's Report:

2013 saw our club net \$1,067 in profit as seen in the unaudited P & L, all in all not a bad year considering the state of the economy. Our total income for the year was \$10,517 and our total expenses were \$9,449.

Our two plant auctions saw us bring in a total of \$6,338 in income with offsetting expenses of \$2,931 for a total of \$3,406 in net income.

The Daylily Bingo game brought in \$395.

The remainder of our income came primarily from the auctions of daylilies from the three guest speakers that we had. The income we derived from the three speakers was \$3,706 however the expenses for Travel, Hotels and Auction reimbursements totaled \$4,024 for a \$318 deficit.

Room rental for the year at Tower Hill was \$1,675 and other miscellaneous expenses were \$125 for the Photo Contest and \$560 for the July Exhibition expenses and prizes.

Needless to say, everything growing here has been proven hardy over a number of winters and given the size of my gardens, they have to survive on nature alone for water and nutrients.
